Through intentional partnerships with like-minded organizations such as the Interfaith Center on Corporate Responsibility (ICCR) and As You Sow among others, we harness the power of direct engagement with corporate leadership, endorse initiatives aligned with justice-driven policies, and mobilize our influence as investment advisors to ensure that financial power advances equity. Our recent efforts include:

- Walmart Racial Justice Audit We partnered with ICCR urging Walmart to address racial discrimination, bias, and disparities in its policies and practices.
- <u>Costco Shareholders Vote in Support of DEI Measures</u> We partnered with Whistle Stop Capital and As You Sow to sign a shareholder letter reinforcing investor support for corporate DEI initiatives. This signals to Costco's leadership that investors expect continued commitment to inclusive business practices.
- National Black Workers Bill of Rights We partnered with the National Black Worker Center to support policies that
 protect and uplift over 20 million Black workers nationwide. By signing a petition in direct advocacy for stronger labor
 standards, we continue to stand for economic justice and workplace protections.

ABOUT BLACK HISTORY MONTH

National Black History Month has its origins in 1915 when Dr. Carter G. Woodson, a historian and author, founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History. Initially celebrated as a week, Black History Month was expanded to a month-long national observance in 1976 under President Ford. Black History Month honors the contributions of Black individuals whose achievements are often overlooked and provides a space to reflect on the ongoing fight for equality.
